
- To recognise efforts put in by schools on environmental management and education.

Eligibility

- All registered schools under the Education Bureau (EDB) are eligible.
- The Schools Sector is further divided into three sub-sectors, namely Pre-schools, Primary School and Secondary School.
- Gold Award winners of each sub-sector of the previous year will not be eligible to join the HKAEE within the next two years.







- Schools that have successfully applied for facilitator support will also be invited to attend a <u>Networking Workshop</u> to allow facilitators and school staff of the facilitated schools to meet in person and connect.






