1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background

The Hong Kong Awards for Environmental Excellence (the HKAEE) is led by the Environmental Campaign Committee (ECC) alongside the Environment and Ecology Bureau (EEB) and in conjunction with nine organisations, in alphabetical order, the Advisory Council on the Environment, the Business Environment Council, the Chinese General Chamber of Commerce, the Chinese Manufacturers' Association of Hong Kong, the Federation of Hong Kong Industries, the Hong Kong Chinese Importers' & Exporters' Association, the Hong Kong Council of Social Service, the Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce and the Hong Kong Productivity Council. The HKAEE is an annual award which aims to encourage companies and organisations to adopt green management, benchmark their performance with the best practices within their sectors, and recognise the achievements of the best-performing companies and organisations.

As an environmental award that aims for excellence, the Awards take the pyramidal shape as the form of its logo to show the commitment of different sectors of society for reaching excellence in environmental performance. At the apex of the logo is a tender leaf that symbolises the growth of environmental awareness in the community. The white ribbon that wraps around the pyramid forms the letter "Q" to represent both quality and qualified environmental performance of the awarded organisations.



1.2 Overview of HKAEE

The HKAEE is recognised by the community as one of the most prestigious and reputable award schemes in Hong Kong. Information of this award scheme is summarised in the table below and full details can be found in the individual Guidebooks.

2. 2024 HKAEE (SCHOOLS SECTOR)


2.1 Objectives

- To recognise efforts put in by schools on environmental management and education;
- To encourage schools' continuous improvement in environmental action and performance by integrating environmental elements into school curriculum and long-term development through a whole-school approach;
- To create an overall environmentally friendly ambience within the schools sector; and
- To recognise schools with excellent environmental performance.

2.2 Eligibility

- All registered schools under the Education Bureau (EDB) are eligible to participate in the "2024 HKAEE (Schools Sector)".
- The Schools Sector is further divided into three sub-sectors, namely Pre-schools, Primary School and Secondary School.
- To encourage wider participation, the Gold Award winner of each sub-sector of the previous year will not be eligible to join the HKAEE within the next two years. In other words, Gold Award winners of 2022 HKAEE and 2023 HKAEE (for all three sub-sectors) will not be eligible for entering 2024 HKAEE (Schools Sector), and Gold Award winners of 2024 HKAEE (for all three sub-sectors) will not be eligible to join 2025 and 2026 HKAEE (Schools Sector).
- The Organisers reserve the right to determine the eligibility of any applicant school.

2.4 Programme Activities and Details

2.4.1 Facilitator Support

- To assist participating schools to understand more about the "2024 HKAEE (Schools Sector)", facilitators can be provided for
 mentoring schools by arranging visit(s) or sharing experience and/or providing suitable advice on green management via
 suitable channels on a voluntary basis All facilitators have prior experience in joining the competition and possess different
 skills to provide more holistic support to schools.
- Facilitators would ONLY be assigned to schools upon request. Schools interested in having a facilitator should indicate their request when submitting their applications for the "2024 HKAEE (Schools Sector)". The duration of support will be one school year. Please note that schools that have not received facilitator support in the past two school years will be given higher priority in assigning facilitators. Gold, Silver and Bronze winners of 2022 and 2023 HKAEE are not eligible to apply for the support.
- All schools that have successfully applied for facilitator support will also be invited to attend a Networking Workshop
 (scheduled for mid-February 2025). This workshop will allow facilitators and school staff of the facilitated schools to meet in
 person and connect, as well as share practical experiences and difficulties faced when implementing environmental
 management and education in their schools.
- Heads of Schools are welcome to nominate their teachers to join the networking workshop and may consider counting the
 time teachers spent in the networking workshop as Continuing Professional Development hours. Details will be
 announced via email invitation.

2.4.2 Introductory Briefing cum Experience Sharing Webinars

- To assist schools to learn more about the application and assessment details of the "2024 HKAEE (Schools Sector)" and the
 "2024 Best Green Education Initiative Award", two webinars were organised in late Oct 2024. Representatives of past
 award-winning schools also shared their journey in establishing a green campus and promoting environmental education
 during the webinars. Video recordings and PPT Presentation materials are uploaded to the ECC's Schools Go Green
 website for schools' review
- Heads of Schools are welcome to nominate their teachers to join the webinars and may consider counting the time teachers spent in the networking workshop as Continuing Professional Development hours. All webinars were successfully held (EDB's Training Calendar System Pre-school Course Code: CDI020241278, Primary and Secondary Course Code: CDI020250887).

2.4.3 Winning School Visits cum Environmental Training Activities

- To enable past award-winning schools to share their successful experiences in formulating school environmental
 management measures and implementing environmental education with potential applicant schools, on-site visits to winning
 schools cum environmental training activities were organised in November and December 2024. PPT Presentation materials
 are uploaded to the ECC's Schools Go Green website for schools' review.
- Heads of Schools are welcome to nominate their teachers to join the visits and may consider counting the time teachers spent in the networking workshop as Continuing Professional Development hours. All visits were successfully held (EDB's Training Calendar System Pre-school Course Code: CDI020250554, Primary and Secondary Course Code: CDI020250647).

	 The technical consultant will review the Self-assessment Questionnaire and supporting documents submitted by participating schools and may request supplementary information for verification purposes. The Organisers will shortlist schools for entering Stage 2 – Detailed Assessment. All eligible schools that have completed Stage 1 but with no awards afterwards will receive a Participation Certificate upon completion of all assessment processes.
May – Jul 2025	 Stage 2 – Detailed Assessment Assessors will conduct an on-site visit at each shortlisted school. The visit will comprise a school tour arranged by the school (to showcase the school's environmental facilities and measures) and an interview with the school representatives, including but not limited to its school management, teaching and non-teaching staff, students, etc. During the on-site visit, schools are encouraged to elaborate their environmental initiatives to the assessors through presentation to provide them with an in-depth understanding of their environmental performance and the progress of implementation. Assessors will then prepare the assessment reports for submission to the Organisers for further selection of schools entering Stage 3 – Final Assessment. Participating schools that have successfully completed Stage 2 will receive a complimentary report outlining school's strengths in the aspect of Green Leadership, Programme and Performance and Partner Synergy, and pinpointing areas for further improvements. The report would be very useful to facilitate participating schools to evaluate their performance and identify areas for further advancement.
Sep 2025	 Stage 3 – Final Assessment The Final Adjudicating Panel (the Panel) will comprise representatives from schools, government departments and professional bodies. Each finalist school will be invited to attend the final adjudication meeting to further introduce its environmental projects and achievements. The Panel will conduct final assessment on the environmental performance of each finalist school.

In order to recognise participating schools' efforts in promoting the HKAEE as well as their achievements in the Hong Kong Green Organisation Certification (HKGOC) and other recognised certification or award schemes, a maximum of 10 bonus points will be given to the participating schools during **Stage 2 – Detailed Assessment** of the HKAEE as follows:

(1) Bonus Points Awarded for Efforts in Promoting HKAEE (maximum 3 bonus points)

- If participating schools have promoted HKAEE through their school network and / or promotional channels / platforms (e.g. display the awarded logos and stickers on campus, website, and electronic screens, etc.; imprint the awarded logo in name cards, letterhead; and publish featured articles through media), a maximum of 1 bonus point will be granted.
- If participating schools have successfully referred their partners (e.g. schools that are not under the same School Sponsoring Body, suppliers or contractors, external organisations, etc.) to join the HKAEE, a maximum of 2 bonus points will be granted.

• If participating schools have promoted HKAEE through their school network and successfully referred their partners, they may be awarded with the title of "Outstanding HKAEE Promotional Partner" if they have fulfilled certain criteria. Please refer to the "Outstanding Promotional Partner Commendation Scheme" website for details.

(2) Bonus Points Awarded for Efforts in Hong Kong Green Organisation Certification (HKGOC) (maximum 4 bonus points)

• If participating schools possessed a valid Wastewi\$e / Energywi\$e / IAQwi\$e / Carbon Reduction Certificate / recognition of Hong Kong Green Organisation issued by the ECC, 1 bonus point per Certificate will be granted. A Whole-School Approach to Education for Sustainable Development (ESD)

(Source and reference: WWF)

The assessment criteria for "2024 HKAEE (Schools Sector)" were devised by integrating the core components of the whole-school approach to ESD.

Schools are microcosms of society, where young people establish many social norms and expectations. Environmental education, or in the wider scope of "Education for Sustainable Development (ESD)" is therefore not only about what happens in the classroom, but also about what happens in the whole school and the wider community.

A whole-school approach encompasses the 4Cs - Culture, Curriculum, Campus and Community.

The diagram below illustrates the key aspects of a whole-school approach to ESD. A holistic and integrated approach ensures that sustainability is embedded in the school ethos, teaching and learning, the management of the school estate and links with the wider community. It is a shared, core purpose, bringing together everyone involved in the school to identify changes they want to see, set priorities, plan solutions and put them into action.

Culture

- ESD is embedded in the school's mission and ethos.
- The ways in which the school respects and values sustainability are apparent to students, staff and the whole school community.
- Representatives from the management, teachers, staff and students help to keep ESD high on the school agenda.

Curriculum

- Sustainability is integrated across whole curriculum as well as playing a core part in extra-curricular activity.
- Real-life contexts are used to make it more relevant to students in all subject areas.
- Stimulating learning resources and rich learning environment are provided.
- Students have direct experiences with nature to help develop attitudes of care and respect.
- The curriculum has a global dimension that enriches students' understanding of other cultures and societies



Campus

- Sustainability guides decision-making about procurement, waste management, and energy and water use.
- Involving students in decision-making about purchasing and resource management is seen as a learning opportunity.
- Students are engaged in the design and development of the school grounds.
- The school grounds are part of the learning environment.



Community

- The school is valued as part of the community and the community is valued as part of the school.
- The school fosters productive relationships with parents and values their contribution.
- Students have the capacity and the opportunity to make a positive contribution to the community.
- Students are given the opportunity to share what they have learned.
- The school recognises the links between the local and the global.

There are many ways of developing a whole-school approach to Education for Sustainable Development. It is not something that can be 'completed' and ticked off – it is something we constantly build into our everyday activities. And as the world is always changing, it needs to evolve to keep pace.

Participating schools with excellent environmental performance and achievements will be awarded with a **trophy / certificate and cash prize** at the Awards Presentation Ceremony of the HKAEE. Details of the awards for each sub-sector are listed below:
