1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background

Funded by the Environment and Conservation Fund, the Hong Kong Awards for Environmental Excellence (HKAEE) has been led by the Environmental Campaign Committee (ECC), together with the Environment and Ecology Bureau (EEB) and in conjunction with nine organisations since 2008 (in alphabetical order, the Advisory Council on the Environment, the Business Environment Council, the Chinese General Chamber of Commerce, the Chinese Manufacturers' Association of Hong Kong, the Federation of Hong Kong Industries, the Hong Kong Chinese Importers' & Exporters' Association, the Hong Kong Council of Social Service, the Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce and the Hong Kong Productivity Council).

As an environmental award that aims for excellence, the Awards take the pyramidal shape as the form of its logo to show the commitment of different sectors of society for reaching excellence in environmental performance. At the apex of the logo is a tender leaf that symbolises the growth of environmental awareness in the community. The white ribbon that wraps around the pyramid forms the letter "Q" to represent both quality and qualified environmental performance of the awarded organisations.



1.2 Overview of HKAEE

The HKAEE is recognised by the community as one of the most prestigious and reputable award schemes in Hong Kong. Information of this award scheme is summarised below and full details can be found in the individual Guidebooks.

2. 2026 HKAEE (SCHOOLS SECTOR)

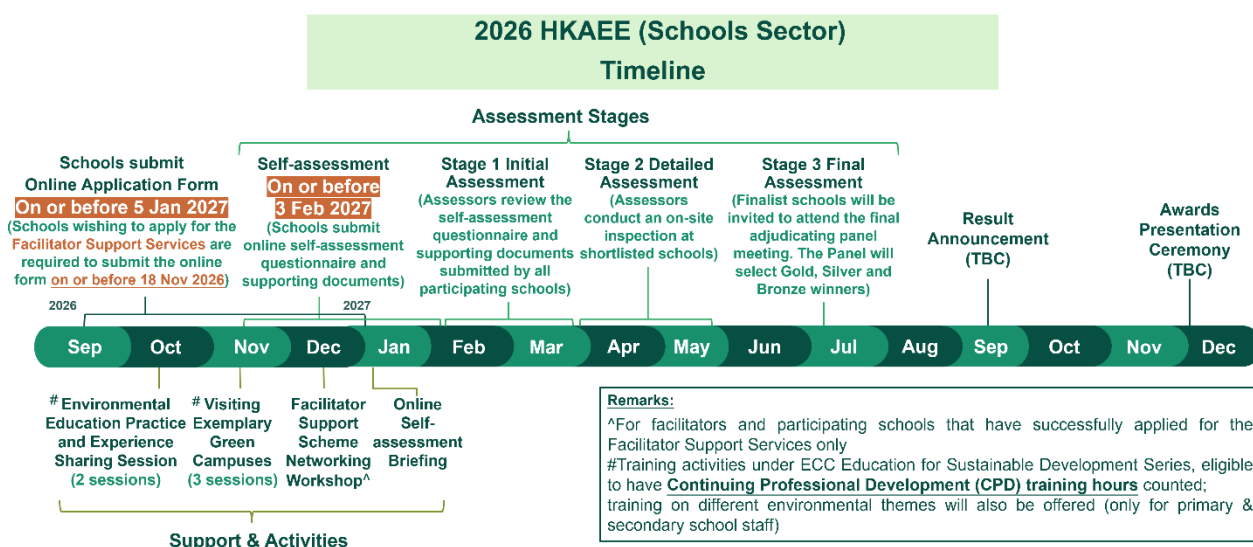
2.1 Objectives

- To recognise efforts put in by schools on environmental management and education;
- To encourage schools' continuous improvement in environmental action and performance by integrating environmental elements into school curriculum and long-term development through a whole-school approach;
- To create an overall environmentally friendly ambience within the schools sector; and
- To recognise schools with excellent environmental performance.

2.2 Eligibility

- All registered schools under the Education Bureau (EDB) are eligible to participate in the “2026 HKAEE (Schools Sector)”.
- The Schools Sector is further divided into three sub-sectors, namely **Pre-schools, Primary School and Secondary School**.
- To encourage wider participation, the Gold Award winner of each sub-sector of the previous year will not be eligible to join the HKAEE within the next two years. In other words, Gold Award winners of 2024 HKAEE and 2025 HKAEE (for all three sub-sectors) will not be eligible for entering 2026 HKAEE (Schools Sector), and Gold Award winners of 2026 HKAEE (for all three sub-sectors) will not be eligible to join 2027 and 2028 HKAEE (Schools Sector).
- The Organisers reserve the right to determine the eligibility of any applicant school.

2.4.2 Online Self-Assessment Briefing

- To familiarise participating schools with the assessment requirements of the “2026 HKAEE (Schools Sector)” and the “2026 Best Green Education Initiative Award”, as well as the use of the online assessment system and preparation for completing the Self-assessment Stage, an online briefing session (Cantonese Session) is tentatively scheduled for **early January 2027**. Activity invitation and application details will be announced via email in due course.

2.4.3 Facilitator Support Scheme

- To assist participating schools to understand more about the “2026 HKAEE (Schools Sector)”, facilitators can be provided for mentoring schools by arranging visit(s) or sharing experience and/or providing suitable advice on green management and environmental education via suitable channels on a voluntary basis. All facilitators have prior experience in joining the competition and possess different skills to provide more holistic support to schools.
- **Facilitators would ONLY be assigned to schools upon request.** Schools interested in having a facilitator should indicate their request when submitting their applications for the “2026 HKAEE (Schools Sector)”. Support services will be provided from December 2026 to July 2027. Please note that schools that have not received facilitator support in the past two years will be given higher priority in assigning facilitators. Besides, Gold, Silver and Bronze winners of the 2024 and 2025 HKAEE are not eligible to apply for the support.
- All schools that have successfully applied for facilitator support will also be invited to attend a **Networking Workshop** (tentatively scheduled for December 2026). This workshop will allow facilitators and staff from the facilitated schools to meet in person and connect, as well as share practical experiences, difficulties faced and solutions adopted when implementing environmental management and education in their schools.
- An electronic certificate will be issued to all attending school heads and teachers as proof of attendance. School heads are welcome to consider counting the time spent in the workshop as CPD training hours. Activity invitation and application details will be announced via email in due course.

Sep 2026 – early Jan 2027	- Schools interested in joining the “2026 HKAEE (Schools Sector)” are required to complete and submit the online application form on or before 5 January 2027 (Tuesday). - If schools wish to apply for Facilitator Support Services in addition to participating in the Award, please submit the “HKAEE” online application form on or before 18 November 2026 (Wednesday). Points to Note - Schools wishing to enrol in more than one school sub-sectors and/or enrol for different campuses are required to submit separate online application forms. - Upon submission of the online application form, an application confirmation email (containing the applicant ID and password for accessing the online assessment system) will be sent to the contact email address provided by your school in the application form. If you do not receive the confirmation email, please check your junk/spam folder first. (Note: To avoid creating duplicate user accounts, please do not submit the same application form more than once.) - If your school (i) does not receive the application confirmation email within seven working days after submitting the application form, or (ii) needs to amend any information provided in the application form, please contact the Technical Consultant of the Scheme (WWF-Hong Kong) by email (hkaee@wwf.org.hk) or by telephone (2864 1477).

Nov 2026 – early Feb 2027	- Upon submitting the application, participating schools are advised to review the Self-assessment Questionnaire Sample [Annex 2 for pre-schools; Annex 3 for primary and secondary schools], in order to prepare the required information and supporting documents in advance for the assessments. The sample is for reference only, submission in paper/PDF format will not be considered. - Participating schools are required to complete and submit the Self-assessment Questionnaire through the online assessment system on or before 3 February 2027 (Wednesday) (<i>tentatively will be open for filling in Nov 2026</i>) to review their environmental performance in the past school year (i.e. 2025/26 school year). Guidelines & Tips - Participating schools are advised to read through “Annex 4 – Guidelines & Highlights of Best Practices (Schools)” to understand the details of the Self-assessment Questionnaire questions and related practical examples. - Schools may also refer to “Reports on Overall Performance of Past Participating Schools” to learn about the ways for improving the school’s environmental performance. - Schools could arrange meetings with facilitators (if necessary) to obtain advice from facilitators to prepare for the submission of Self-assessment Questionnaire.

	<u>Points to Note</u> - To ensure fairness and accuracy during the assessment process, schools are required to <u>submit relevant supporting documents</u> in accordance with the requirements of the questions. Failure in providing elaboration and relevant proofs/evidence may affect the school's ranking in Stage 1 Initial Assessment and the eligibility to be shortlisted for Stage 2 Detailed Assessment. - Schools may refer to "Part (E1) Supporting Documents Checklist" at the end of the questionnaire and ensure relevant supporting documents are uploaded before submitting the questionnaire.

Feb – Mar 2027	<u>Stage 1 – Initial Assessment</u> - The technical consultant will review the Self-assessment Questionnaire and supporting documents submitted by all participating schools, and may contact schools via phone and/or email to verify the content and request to provide supplementary documents. - The technical consultant will rate the environmental performance of all participating schools to assist the Organisers in selecting schools shortlisted for Stage 2 Detailed Assessment.
Apr – May 2027	<u>Stage 2 – Detailed Assessment</u> - Participating schools shortlisted for Stage 2 Detailed Assessment will be eligible to compete for "Outstanding Award" or above. - Assessors will conduct an on-site inspection at each shortlisted school. The inspection will comprise a school tour arranged by the school (to showcase the school's environmental facilities and measures) and an interview with the school representatives, including but not limited to its school management, teaching and non-teaching staff, students, etc. - The technical consultant will rate the environmental performance of all shortlisted schools after the on-site inspections to assist the Organisers in further selecting schools eligible for Stage 3 Final Assessment.
Early Jul 2027	<u>Stage 3 – Final Assessment</u> - The Final Adjudicating Panel (the Panel) will comprise representatives from schools, government departments and professional bodies. - Each finalist school will be invited to attend the final adjudicating panel meeting to further introduce its environmental projects and achievements. The Panel will conduct final assessment on the overall environmental performance of each finalist school to select Gold, Silver and Bronze winners.

2.6 Assessment Criteria

Participating schools will be assessed under three main areas, namely **Green Leadership, Programme and Performance** and **Partner Synergy**, with the following key components and weighting:

B) Programme and Performance 	- Resource Usage and Management (Energy Conservation and Carbon Reduction, Water Conservation, Waste Management, Green Travel, Sustainable School Catering, Green Procurement and Environmental Compliance) - Campus Environment (Greening, Noise Management and Indoor Air Quality Management) - Environmental Education (Implementation and Information Dissemination) - Monitoring and Evaluation on Environmental Management and Education (Performance Review, Reporting and Follow-up Action)	55%
C) Partner Synergy 	- Parents and Families - School Network - Community Members / Other Organisations - Service / Product Suppliers	20%

In order to recognise participating schools' efforts in promoting the HKAEE as well as their achievements in the Hong Kong Green Organisation Certification (HKGOC) and other recognised certification or award schemes, **a maximum of 10 bonus points** will be given to the participating schools during **Stage 1 Initial Assessment** of the HKAEE as follows:

(1) Efforts in Promoting HKAEE (maximum 3 bonus points)

- If participating schools have promoted HKAEE through their school network and / or promotional channels / platforms (e.g. display the awarded logos and stickers on campus, website, and electronic screens, etc.; imprint the awarded logo in name cards, letterhead; and publish featured articles through media), **a maximum of 1 bonus point will be granted.**

- If participating schools have successfully referred their partners (e.g. schools that are not under the same School Sponsoring Body, suppliers or contractors, external organisations, etc.) to join the HKAEE, **a maximum of 2 bonus points will be granted.**

(2) Efforts in Hong Kong Green Organisation Certification (HKGOC) (maximum 3 bonus points)

- If participating schools possessed a valid Wastewi\$e / Energywi\$e / IAQwi\$e / Carbon Reduction Certificate / recognition of Hong Kong Green Organisation issued by the ECC, **1 bonus point per Certificate will be granted.** Please refer to the [HKGOC](#) website for details.

(3) Efforts in Other Environmental Schemes (maximum 4 bonus points)

- If schools have participated in and possessed a valid certificate from the following schemes, **1 bonus point per scheme** will be granted:

Certification 	✓ * Gold, Silver, Bronze, Outstanding Award and Certificate of Merit awardees will also automatically be granted the title of the “Hong Kong Green Organisation” under the ECC’s Hong Kong Green Organisation Certification (HKGOC).
Report 	✓ Participating schools that have successfully completed Stage 2 Detailed Assessment will receive an environmental performance report prepared by the technical consultant, outlining the school’s strengths in the areas of Green Leadership, Programme and Performance, and Partner Synergy, and identifying areas for further improvement. The report will support participating schools in evaluating their environmental performance and identifying opportunities for further advancement. ✓ Participating schools that are not shortlisted for Stage 2 Detailed Assessment but are awarded with the “ Certificate of Merit ” will receive a recommendation report prepared by the technical consultant. The report will provide specific suggestions based on the areas of weakness identified during the Stage 1 Initial Assessment, to support the school’s ongoing improvement on its environmental performance.
Certificate 	✓ All participating schools that have completed Stage 1 Initial Assessment but with no awards afterwards will receive an electronic “ Participation Certificate ” upon completion of all assessment stages.

3. 2026 Best Green Education Initiative Award

In addition to the “2026 HKAEE (Schools Sector)”, “2026 Best Green Education Initiative Award” is also launched to encourage schools to develop initiatives in promoting sustainability and/or carbon neutrality, as well as to recognise and gather good exemplars of environmental education practices in the Schools Sector. Schools can choose to participate in both awards above or either one. Schools interested in applying for both “2026 HKAEE (Schools Sector)” and “2026 Best Green Education Initiative Award” are required to submit [separate online application forms](#).

Annex: A Whole-School Approach to Education for Sustainable Development (ESD)

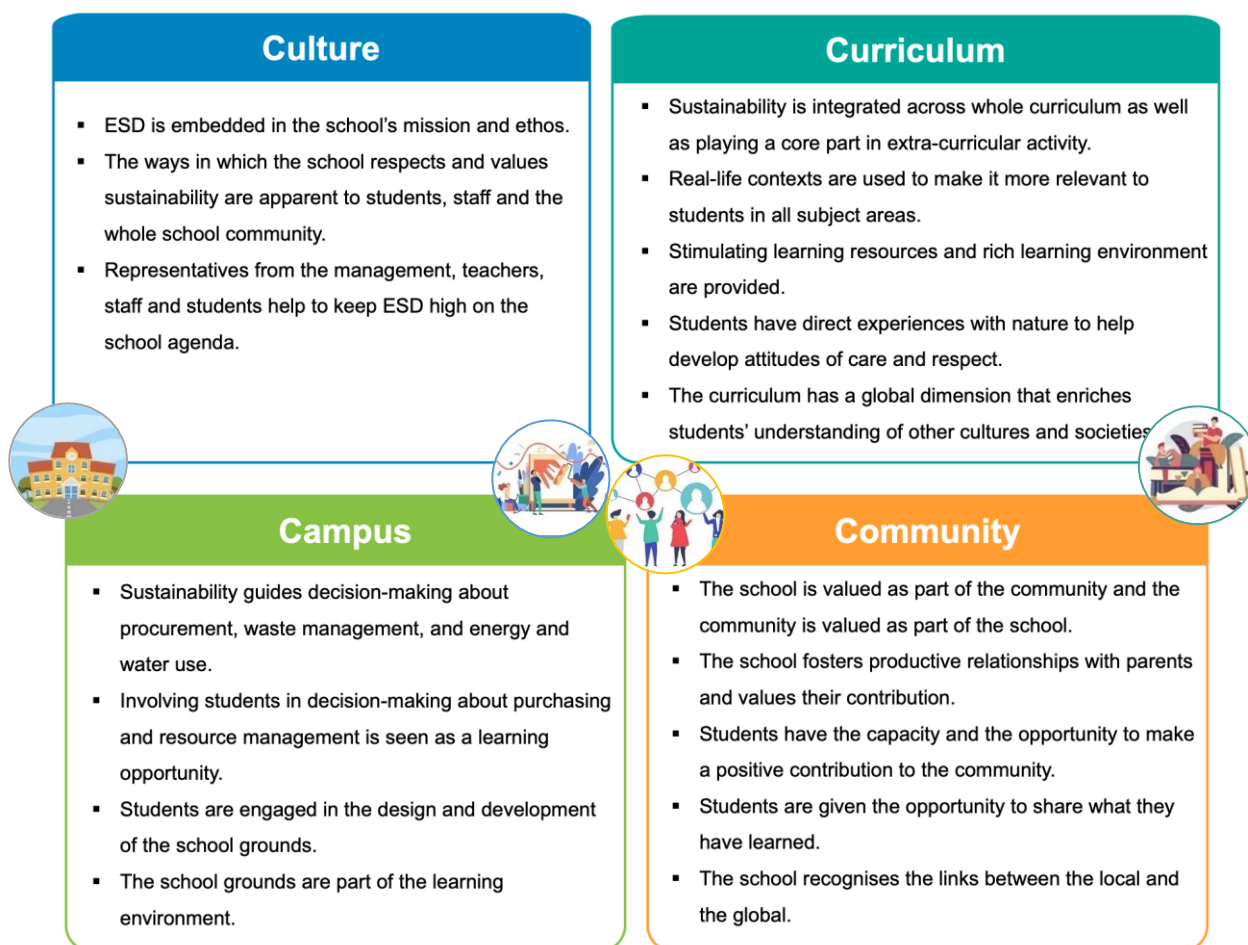

The **assessment criteria for “2026 HKAEE (Schools Sector)”** were devised by integrating the core components of **the whole-school approach to ESD**.

Schools are microcosms of society, where young people establish many social norms and expectations. Environmental education, or in the wider scope of “Education for Sustainable Development (ESD)” is therefore not only about what happens in the classroom, but also about what happens in the whole school and the wider community.

A whole-school approach encompasses the 4Cs – Culture, Curriculum, Campus and Community.

The diagram below illustrates the key aspects of a whole-school approach to ESD. A holistic and integrated approach ensures that sustainability is embedded in the school ethos, teaching and learning, the management of the school estate and links with the wider community. It is a shared, core purpose, bringing together everyone involved in the school to identify changes they want to see, set priorities, plan solutions and put them into action.



There are many ways of developing a whole-school approach to Education for Sustainable Development. It is not something that can be ‘completed’ and ticked off – it is something we constantly build into our everyday activities. And as the world is always changing, it needs to evolve to keep pace.
